Grass areas are being managed according to Grass Cutting guidelines and looking exceptionally good. The whole appearance of the lower section of the site is exactly as was envisaged on the April site visit, due to the excellent work of the ground staff.

The two areas on either side of the path leading from Llechyfedach school end is developing into a varied wildlife meadow with lots of native plants flowering.

It will be worth the Environmental group to have a site visit to see how this is all looking very natural and a bit like an old fashioned Hay meadow.

Several grass 'paths' kept shorter and leading through meadow areas and over to the orchard. Looking very good.





The orchard trees need both summer and winter pruning to improve shape and growth. they will also be in competition with grass for nutrients and water.

Advice will need to be taken regarding their care.

Top section of Park.

No work has been carried out in this section, further discussion when we find out if there is grant funding available.

Several large clumps of native bluebells were visible, when bracken is tackled (hopefully) in September the bluebells will be more visible next spring.



It would be an improvement if the two paths up through the bracken to the viewing area at the top could be strimmed and widened to make it more inviting for the summer months.
