Minutes of the Community Engagement, Well-being & Events Committee of Llannon Community Council Monday, 12th February 2024 at 11:00am Held remotely via Zoom.

The Chair of the Council, Cllr. Julie Owen presided over the meeting.

Minute No. 2 – Apologies and reasons for absence.

All Members of the Committee were present.

Minute No. 3 – Declarations of Interests.

There were no new declarations of interests.

Minute No. 4 – To discuss budget requirements for 2024-25.

It was noted that the Clerk had previously circulated the proposed budget recommended of £20,000 for this Committee. Cllr. Llinos Davies raised concerns that this seemed to be a lot of money.

The Clerk reminded the Members of the recent survey results. In particular, the loneliness and isolation which is affecting many residents in Llannon Ward, particularly those over the age of fifty.

The Clerk is currently working on a project to tackle this issue and feels that a good starting point would be to re-establish Cinio a Chlonc. Dolen Teifi's new minibus will be available soon so this is the ideal opportunity to start this project. This will require significant outlay but in return would also bring in an income as there would be a small charge.

The Clerk noted that LICC is creating a Volunteer Hub, some of which have already been trained to drive the new minibus. A budget will be required to hire the bus for other future LICC projects.

The Clerk also advised that this budget would need to cover the publication and distribution of future LICC newsletters. It was agreed that details would need to be discussed in more depth at a later date to agree the number of editions to be published and how they would be circulated.

The establishment of a Repair Café and Youth Council was also discussed and it was agreed that this will also need further consideration at a later date.

Further discussion took place regarding whether the amount requested could be reduced. It was agreed that £20,000 would be necessary for LICC to offer additional services to benefit the community.

The Chair closed the meeting at 11.55am.
